In early 2026, The Wheeler Centre will showcase two of the most original and acclaimed voices in contemporary fiction, hosting Pulitzer Prize-winner Percival Everett and acclaimed author Nell Zink live in Melbourne.

In February, revered American writer **Percival Everett** joins journalist and broadcaster **Osman Faruqi** to discuss his Pulitzer Prize-winning novel *James*, a bold and transformative reimagining of *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*. In *James*, Everett flips the perspective of Mark Twain's American classic, giving voice and agency to Huck's enslaved companion Jim. The result is a gripping, funny and profoundly relevant work – a sharp reckoning with identity, race and the American canon. Everett will also reflect on his decades-spanning career and the acclaimed adaptation of his novel *Erasure* into the Oscar-winning film









American Fiction. In his first visit to Australia and only event in Melbourne, Everett appears exclusively at University of Melbourne's Union Theatre, presented by The Wheeler Centre.

The following month, novelist **Nell Zink** takes The Wheeler Centre stage to discuss her seventh and much-lauded novel *Sister Europe* with author **Jaclyn Crupi**. Set at a literary award ceremony in Berlin, Zink's dazzling satire unpacks the pretensions, contradictions and longings of modern life through an ensemble of sharply drawn characters. A Guggenheim Fellow and author of Avalon, Doxology and *Nicotine*, Zink has been hailed as one of contemporary fiction's most distinctive and fearless voices. She is celebrated for her biting humour, intellectual precision and unflinching insight into the absurdities of our age.

Building on the momentum of the previously announced *An Evening with Sir Salman Rushdie*, these appearances underscore The Wheeler Centre's commitment to bringing the world's most influential literary voices to Australian audiences.

Appearing in conversation with **Sisonke Msimang** at Melbourne Town Hall in August 2026, Rushdie will reflect on his extraordinary life and career – from the Booker Prize-winning *Midnight's Children* to his recent memoir *Knife* – and explore the ideas that have shaped a generation. Marking his first visit to Australia in over a decade and the first since the brutal attack that almost cost his life, Rushdie's exclusive Melbourne appearance is set to be one of the most anticipated literary events of the year.

The general public Early Bird ticket on sale for *An Evening with Salman Rushdie* and the forthcoming events with **Percival Everett** and **Nell Zink** begins today.
