


## THE WHEELER CENTRE PRESENTS SIR SALMAN RUSHDIE LIVE IN MELBOURNE

Tuesday 21 October



One of the world's most acclaimed contemporary authors Salman Rushdie returns to Melbourne for one night only to discuss the transformative power of literature and his commitment to the written word. Celebrated for his lifelong work and unwavering advocacy for freedom of expression, Rushdie will appear live at Melbourne Town Hall on Monday 17 August 2026 for what promises to be one of the year's most anticipated literary events.

Marking Rushdie's first visit to Australia in more than a decade, this wide-ranging conversation will explore the enduring role of the writer in a divided world and the redemptive power of art in times of adversity. Reflecting on his extraordinary life and career, Rushdie will delve into the ideas and stories that











have shaped a generation and cemented his place as one of the defining voices of the 20th and 21st centuries.

Born in India and educated in England, Rushdie rose to international prominence with *Midnight's Children* (1981), the Booker Prize—winning novel that transformed postcolonial literature and established him as a master of magical realism. His body of work — including *The Satanic Verses, The Moor's Last Sigh, The Ground Beneath Her Feet, Shalimar the Clown, Quichotte* and his deeply moving memoir *Knife: Meditations After an Attempted Murder* — spans five decades and has earned Rushdie global acclaim for its wit, imagination and political daring.

Since the attempt on his life in 2022, Rushdie has continued to write and speak publicly with courage and conviction, reaffirming his belief in the power of storytelling to illuminate truth and sustain the human spirit.

Appearing in conversation with author and columnist Sisonke Msimang, Rushdie's Melbourne event will offer audiences a rare opportunity to hear directly from a writer whose work and personal journey have come to symbolise both the freedom and the fragility of artistic expression. The event will also follow the release of Rushdie's new short story collection, *The Eleventh Hour*, to be published in November 2025 – a poignant meditation on life, death and the moments that define us.

## An Evening with Salman Rushdie

Salman Rushdie, Sisonke Msimang Monday 17 August 2026, 7pm to 8.30pm Melbourne Town Hall

Salman Rushdie appears in Melbourne presented by The Wheeler Centre (17 August 2026) and in Sydney as part of the Festival of Dangerous Ideas (22-23 August 2026).

Salman Rushdie is the bestselling author of 22 books, including *Midnight's Children*, which won both the Booker Prize and the Best of the Booker; *Shame*, *The Satanic Verses*, *The Moor's Last Sigh*, and *Quichotte*, all of which were shortlisted for the Booker Prize; *East West*, a collection of stories; *Joseph Anton*, a memoir; *The Jaguar Smile*, a work of reportage; and three collections of essays, including Languages of *Truth*. His 2024 book, *Knife: Meditations After an Attempted Murder*, was a finalist for the 2024 National Book Award for nonfiction. Rushdie is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Letters and a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and he is a Distinguished Writer in Residence at New York University. He is a former president of PEN America and the recipient of the PEN Centenary Courage Award. His books have been translated into over 40 languages. In 2023, he was named one of *Time's* 100 Most Influential People of the Year and has received a Queen's knighthood for his 'services to literature'. His new book, a collection of short fiction titled *The Eleventh Hour*, is published November 2025.
