Hailing from across the continent, each Next Chapter recipient will receive AUD\$15,000 to develop a major writing project over 12 months, supported by a dedicated mentor and a cohort of peers. The program also includes a week-long residency at Varuna, The National Writers' House, offering fellows the time, guidance and community to bring their stories to life.













The Wheeler Centre will also collaborate closely with each recipient to help bring their stories to life, providing ongoing career support and creating opportunities for publishers, booksellers and readers to discover and champion their work.

The Next Chapter program is presented by The Wheeler Centre with generous support from the Koshland Innovation Extension Fund, a sub-fund of Australian Communities Foundation, Creative Australia, the Victorian State Government, the Malcolm Robertson Foundation and the University of Melbourne's Faculty of Arts.
