Acclaimed journalist and academic Masha Gessen leads Wheeler Centre's latest winter events

Russian-American journalist, writer and activist **Masha Gessen** will return to Melbourne for an unmissable analysis of imperialism, corruption, autocracy and the state of modern democracy presented by The Wheeler Centre this August.

The renowned reporter will be joined by ABC Global Affairs Editor **John Lyons** and host **Louisa Lim** for a discussion examining the looming threats and challenges to the current world order.

Having spent more than 20 years as a journalist and editor in Moscow, Gessen is one of the world's leading experts on authoritarianism. A staff writer for the New Yorker and Distinguished Professor at the Craig Newmark Graduate School of Journalism, Gessen is the author of numerous bestselling books, including *Surviving Autocracy* and *The Future Is History: How Totalitarianism Reclaimed Russia*.

With Gessen named on the Kremlin's wanted list last year, their writing remains as powerful as it is dangerous. And with more than half of the world's population able to vote in elections this year – including the pivotal upcoming US election – there has never been a more urgent time to confront the future of democracy.

Of Masha's appearance and The Wheeler Centre's forthcoming program, **CEO Erin Vincent** said: 'The Wheeler Centre is proud to feature such esteemed speakers to debate and interrogate these complex global issues. This special in-conversation event brings together journalists with a depth of experience and will be a chance to hear their analysis on the state of democracy, at an important time in our history.'
